First we thought six people were coming, then we heard 12. Once the event began, 18 people showed up (mostly Mexicans from an hour or two away) representing seven organizations.



But a crowd was no problem. David is gifted at drawing out and helping people use their talents. Soon enough, he had all of these eager volunteers working on something that would help make camp better.

Three languages were spoken around the rough "Alaskan" saw-milled plank table supported by hay bails. In addition to great meals, there was song, prayer, devotionals and good old get-to-know-you interaction.



My job was to feed these hungry men. Thanks to God's timing, my indoor kitchen was ready to work for me. If the group had come two years before as originally planned, the kitchen would not have yet been built. These guys ate like 30 kids at camp! My prayers were answered. God expanded the food and made it taste good to the different nationalities and tastebuds around the table. He is good.



God's presence was felt and at times we experienced the touch of His healing hand. One of the participants was suffering greatly and couldn't eat or sleep. By the time he left he was feeling better, eating and sleeping again. Praise God!




